## Why?

- Reduce impacts to landowners/producers
- Relationships with landowners
  - 80% private land
    - Raise most wildlife
    - Provide habitat
    - Provide hunting access
- Responsible wildlife management
  - Supported by sportsmen and women







## History

- 1939 Created in SDCL
  - 40-36-9 Programs and rules for control of injurious animals—Payment of expenses

The Department of Game, Fish and Parks may direct or employ personnel and conduct programs and the Game, Fish and Parks Commission may adopt pursuant to chapter 1-26 necessary rules to control foxes, coyotes, feral dogs, prairie dogs, and other wild animals. The expenses thereof shall be paid out of the Department of Game, Fish and Parks fund or the state animal damage control fund.

- 1974 More formalized to provide assistance to producers
  - Predator and nuisance species
- 2009 Restructured
  - Signed MOU with USDA-Wildlife Services
  - Increased efficiencies
- 2013
  - Added three new positions (27 full-time employees)
- 2016
  - Added 2<sup>nd</sup> aircraft
- 2017
  - Added one full-time gunner for 2<sup>nd</sup> aircraft















Fiscal Year 2017 Results

#### **Predator Control**







- FY 2017, spent over \$873,000
  - Responded to 1,168 requests for service
  - Worked with 904 landowners/producers

#### Aerial Predator Control

- USDA-Wildlife Services
  - Primary provider
  - GFP funds second aircraft
    - Approx. \$160,000/year
    - Flew 378 hours
  - Emergency contract in Feb. 2017
    - Federal planes grounded
    - \$5,000 from Multi-County PCD
- Partnered with predator control districts
  - Reimbursed \$7,000
  - Utilized permitted pilots

## Overall Coyote/Fox Removal



## Coyote/Fox Control




FY 2017 efforts = Nearly 6,800 animals removed


#### What did 2017 bring?





# 2015 ADC Survey Results





- Recommendation from the ADC Policy Advisory Committee
- Surveyed nearly 1,600 producers
- Coyote control was the number one type of service requested
- 80% were satisfied or very satisfied with current ADC program services
- Large number of comments for increased levels of aerial predator control
  - Responsible for addition of 2<sup>nd</sup> aircraft

## **Program Impacts**

- Fiscal Year 2017
  - Responded to 1,622 requests for assistance
  - Impacted 1,282 landowners/producers
- Effective and efficient program
  - Many partners
    - Cooperating landowners/producers
    - **USDA** Wildlife Services
    - Predator Control Districts
    - Other agencies
